- To deliver high-quality PSHE education which will engage and inspire our pupils to develop a love of PSHE.

- The Jigsaw approach to PSHE will be used to develop innovative provision to meet the needs of all our pupils.
- To embed PSHE across the Academy using a progressive curriculum.
- For all children to be taught PSHE through a whole school approach, with all year groups working on the same theme (Jigsaw puzzle piece) at the same time.

IMPLEMENTATION

- All children will receive a balanced curriculum involving PSHE being taught at the beginning of each term.
- PSHE is an important part of school assemblies, where children's spiritual, moral, social and cultural curiosity is stimulated, challenged and nurtured.
- The Jigsaw approach to PSHE will be used to develop the progression of PSHE knowledge, concepts and skills.
- Establish safe, open and positive learning environments based on trusting relationships between all members of the class, adults and children.
- A Jigsaw charter will be used to agree 'ground rules' to ensure PSHE lessons are effective and meaningful.
- Our PSHE curriculum will be enhanced through our Personal Development Awards, encouraging children to uphold key values (Respect, Honest & Trustworthy, Resilience, Determined, Kind & Caring, Outstanding Citizenship).

IMPACT

- Through the use of the Jigsaw approach to PSHE, all children will be given the opportunity to reflect on their own learning and personal development.
- Children will show improved emotional resilience, awareness of emotions and concentration.
- PSHE curriculum significantly contributes to our academy's Safeguarding and Equality Duties, the Government's British Values agenda and the SMSC (Spiritual, Moral, Social, Cultural) development opportunities provided for our children.
- Children will display positive attitudes and behaviour and develop healthy relationships with one another.
